Library Catalog Search

Search here to find books, media, and other resources in the Library collections.

Don't overlook the book! Books can provide valuable background information on all kinds of topics. Be sure to use your time wisely when looking at books for research, too -- quickly browsing the table of contents in the front of the book and the index in the back can provide valuable clues as to whether or not the book will provide information you can use.

The Library Catalog first searches the material available in the CCC Library collection then expands its search to other libraries. Please note which library search is chosen.

Reference Materials

What are reference books?

Reference books are a great place to get a broad overview of a topic or concept. From traditional encyclopedias and dictionaries to subject-specific materials, our library has many resources to help you. Below is a list of reference tools available in electronic format.

- **Encyclopedia Britannica Academic Edition**
Includes Encyclopedia Britannica, World Data Analysis (statistics on countries of world), Gateway to the Classics, Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary and more.
- **Gale Virtual Reference Library**
Gale Virtual Reference Library is a database of encyclopedias and specialized reference sources for multidisciplinary research.

Use the Reference Materials box to find background information about your topic. *Gale Virtual Reference Library* contains subject specific reference material while *Encyclopedia Britannica Academic Edition* is a general encyclopedia that covers many topics.

When Do I Use That Type of Research Material?

| Reference books & databases | Help with topic selection and background research |
| Book & ebooks | In-depth research. Plus use the index to find small bits of relevant information. |
| Popular magazines | Published news articles |
| Scholarly journals | Peer-reviewed research |
| Newspapers | Current issues, possibly focused on regional impact |
| Trade journals | Industry news |
| Websites | Information about companies & organizations, other relevant info. Watch for bias and intent! |

Locate Articles

Use the **Finding Articles** tab to access our databases to find articles.

General Databases

- **ProQuest Research Library**

Search for coverage of a broad range of subjects including arts, business, children, education, general interest, health, humanities, international, law, military, multicultural, psychology, sciences, social sciences, and women's interests.

- **Academic Search Complete**

Comprehensive scholarly, multi-disciplinary full-text database, with more than 7,400 full-text periodicals, including more than 6,800 peer-reviewed journals

The **General Databases** box lists 2 databases that cover all subject areas. If you would like to see complete list of databases, use the subject-specific databases link in the **Subject Databases** box.

The **Current Issues** box lists databases that can help you with your argumentative papers, as well as help you find a current topic if you are having trouble thinking of one. *CQ Researcher* covers topics in-depth with a new report published each week. *Gale Opposing Viewpoints* and *Points of View Reference Center* provide essays and articles to support both sides of an argument on a topic.

Current Issues

If you are researching a controversial topic or current issue for a position paper, the following databases can help.

- **CQ Researcher**

Provides analysis of issues in the news, including health, social trends, criminal justice, international affairs, education, the environment, technology and the economy.


- **Gale Opposing Viewpoints in Context**

Contextual information and opinions on hundreds of today's hottest social issues. It features continuously updated viewpoint articles, topic overviews, full-text magazines, academic journals, news articles, primary source documents, statistics, images, videos, audio files and links to vetted websites.

- **Points of View Reference Center**

Points of View Reference Center is a full text database designed to provide students and schools with a series of controversial essays that present multiple sides of a current issue. Essays provide questions and materials for further thought and study and are accompanied by thousands of supporting articles from the world's top political and societal publications.

Locate Publications (Magazines, Journals and Newspapers)

 **Journal Locator**

Enter a journal, newspaper or magazine title.

Search

Or use the **Journal Locator** search interface.

The Journal Locator provides information on journals, newspapers, magazines, and all other periodicals currently available through the Arthur A. Houghton, Jr. Library for the faculty, staff and students of Corning Community College.

The **Journal Locator** search allows you to enter a publication title and find out if the databases contain the publication. This is very useful if you have found a citation of an article and you need to get the actual article. Remember, if we do not have the publication in our databases, we can borrow the material through Interlibrary Loan. Use the Interlibrary Loan link on the Library page in MyCCC.
